

On Sunday 18 February, the Galizans took to the polls to elect their new government.

The Galizan Nationalist Bloc ran an intense campaign, filled with the hope of la new dawn for our nation. Our members and sympathisers worked unflaggingly to explain our policy proposals and to canvas support by talking directly to voters.

The enthusiasm and the growing groundswell of hope with sights set on the possibility of la political change in Galiza could be felt in the meetings and massive rallies, which filled the largest venues in the country.





